

## This week in EYFS and Key Stage 1

PRESCHOOL











In Literacy this week, we have been reading 'Owl Babies' and have been writing some captions to match scenes in the story. In Maths, we have been focusing on the number 6 and simple repeating patterns. In Understanding the World, we have been exploring the veins we can see on leaves. We looked at our own veins on our wrists and compared them to ones on leaves. We then did some leaf rubbings so we could see the veins in more detail. We have continued drawing some Autumn trees in Art, using the right colours for the leaves and smudging the chalk pastels to create different effects. In PE, we focused on our balancing and climbing skills.

Year 1



We've had another busy week, learning lots in our new topics. In English, we wrote our own Firework Party poems and decorated them. In Maths, we have been learning to count in tens, fives and twos. We started our new art unit, learning about the sculptor Joana Vasconcelos and the huge sculptures she's made using everyday materials. In History, we learnt about how the Great Fire of London started in Thomas Farriner's bakery down Pudding Lane. The children made their own bakery's with lots of things inside that made the fire grow. In DT, we have started learning about the features of Tudor houses including jetties, wattle and daub and black wooden beams.



This week in English, we created a story map to retell the story of Little Red Riding Hood. We then created a new story map with our own fantastic fairytale characters. Year 2 have been learning about 2D and 3D shape, partitioning and doubling this week in Maths. We have also started to design a chair for Goldilocks in DT and we learnt about acts of kindness in PSHE. On Friday, we made Remembrance Day poppies which are on display in our classroom.

## This week in Key Stage 2



Year 3 have had another fantastic week. In DT this week, we have been busy investigating Soup - finding out how it's made and how it tastes. We tried different soups and scored against the label, appearance and the nutritional value. We have been working on multiplication facts for the 3- and 4-times tables in Maths. In English, we have had another busy week learning about Fables: we planned out and wrote diary entries from two perspectives - Hare and the Tortoise! We included time conjunctions and adverbials.




This week, we have been really busy writing our innovated versions of the Legend of Beddgelert. The children have thought of some super creative twists and have really thought about including the grammar techniques we have been practising at the start of lessons. We had fun in French practising our pets vocabulary and playing Bingo – the children have really impressed me by remembering some tricky vocabulary! We have also taken a closer look at Judaism and how the synagogue helps Jewish people to live a good life.





Year 5 have had another busy week continuing to explore the topic of space. This week we have been on a scavenger hunt finding out about the planets in our solar system. We then used these facts to create an information poster. I must also mention the homework that has been handed in so far this half term. I have been blown away by the effort that the children have put into creating models of the solar system, time machines and writing some amazing diary entries and interviews with aliens – well done all!





This week in English, Year 6 have been studying Shakespeare's Macbeth and looking at how he transforms from noble hero to villainous king. In Maths, we got to grips brilliantly with long division methods as well as using common multiples to find equivalent fractions. In Science, we continued our exploration of the circulatory system and focused in on how our heart reacts when we exercise. In History, we were given our own fountain pens to write our own letters as evacuee children. In Art, we produced a series of studies in our sketchbooks of poppies to commemorate Remembrance Day.
