This week in EYFS and Key Stage 1

PESCHOOL



This week in Preschool we have been reading 'The Best Diwali Ever' to help us learn about the festival of Diwali. We decorated our home corner with colourful flower garlands and tealights to help us role play our own Diwali party, had a go at creating Mehndi patterns with paint, and used our fine motor skills to create amazing, sparkly Diya lamps! As a group art project, we made a large Rangoli pattern using flower petals, pastels, and tissue paper. We also had a lovely visit from one of the year 6 pupils, who kindly shared her own firsthand experience and knowledge of Diwali with the children.

eception



This week we have been reading 'The Dark, Dark Night' and have been talking about shadows. We have been exploring the shadows different objects make and have been using our Phonics to write what we think they are. In Maths, we have been focusing on the number 8. In Understanding the World, we have been learning about Harvest! We have been looking at the different vegetables that are grown during harvest and have learnt a song to help us understand the process. This week in Art, we have been using the vegetables that are grown during the harvest period to create some repeating pattern prints, looking at the different shapes and sizes. In PE, we continued to focus on rolling in a variety of ways. Reminder - Please send your children's nativity costumes in by Friday 8th December.

This week in English, we have been learning to retell the Zog using our story maps. We then made our own changes to the main characters and events ready to write them next week. In Maths, we have been learning about $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$ as equal parts of the whole. In Art, we explored different lines and used chalk, pastels, crayons, pens and felt tips to create fireworks. In History, we role played what it was like in London as the fire spread and wrote speech bubbles of what people might have been shouting. In DT, we started to think about the recycled materials we will need to make our Tudor houses. The children have continued to learn our nativity songs.



Year 2 have published their fantastic fairytales this week in English. In maths, we have been solving tricky problems using our 2-, 5- and 10-times tables. We also learnt how to use and read tables, bar charts and tally charts. We have evaluated our chair design for Goldilocks in DT and we have started our stop-motion animations in Computing. Well done Year 2 for working so hard this week, practising our nativity play lines and all of the songs.

This week in Key Stage 2



Year 3 have been working collaboratively - their task was to come up with a game they could play together using only two pieces of equipment. Their ideas have been fantastic! We had fun in French learning numbers and playing bingo! In Maths we have been looking at different ways to divide 2-digit numbers by 1 digit number. In English, the class have been planning their own fables using The Hare and Tortoise as a model. They found out lots of facts about their 2 chosen animals.



We have finished off our own fantasy stories based on the Firework Maker's Daughter and they are fantastic! The class have really taken on board feedback to continually improve their writing. We will be moving onto Explanation Texts next week. We've spent time on Computing this week tinkering with the Microbit programming platform ahead of making a programme and uploading it to Microbits to see the programmed sequence in action. The class are enjoying their gymnastics lessons in PE

The children have been continuing to enjoy and explore their topics of science-fiction and Space. We have been learning about how day and night works in relation to the Earth's rotation and planning our own versions of a science-fiction text. I look forward to reading what the children have created! We have also been building on our work in art, looking at Damien Hirst's artwork for inspiration to create Mexican Day of the Dead inspired skulls. Keep up the good work, Year 5! Swimming lessons start on Monday 4th December. We will be going every afternoon in school time, transport will be provided.





This week in English, we watched a silent animated film called The Piano and we wrote our own moving versions of it. Wonderful authorship from every pupil! In Maths, we used protractors to accurately measure and draw angles and calculate missing angles. In Science, we investigated how exercise affects our heart rate by checking our pulses after different activities. In Art, we created a line drawing of the Old Cathedral in Coventry (which was heavily bombed during WW2) and our finished pieces look so visually striking.
